☐ First, log in to Imagine Galileo using your educator credentials to make sure your login credentials work and you can access the platform. Contact your administrator if you need assistance.
GOALS AND USES
☐ Review your district's assessment plan.
☐ Identify district, school, and/or classroom goals:
□ Determine the ways you plan to use Imagine Galileo
☐ Benchmark Assessments ☐ Assignments
☐ Formative Assessments ☐ Interim Assessments
Before students' first session:
☐ Share basic overview information, such as estimated assessment time (1-2 sessions)
 ☐ Establish a conducive assessment environment (use of headphones encouraged) ☐ Enable translation and text-to-speech under scheduling settings, if needed.
TIP: Share goals with stakeholders (students, families, paraprofessionals, etc).
SET-UP TASKS
Student Management □ Ensure students have Imagine Galileo accounts:
 If your district/school automatically pulls students from your Student Information System (SIS),
check that your classes are correct.
 If you are responsible for creating students individually, select the Users & Classes/Groups button from the product portal (this action is done before selecting the Imagine Galileo tile). Once on the Users & Classes/Groups page, click Add button to create a student.
☐ Manage students to update existing student accounts and/or update student settings as needed.
 Select Users & Classes/Groups button from product portal > Students tab and action.

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SET-UP TASKS, cont'd

Classroom Management

- ☐ Ensure classes have been created.
 - If your district/school automatically pulls students from your Student Information System (SIS), check that your classes are correct.
 - If you are responsible for creating classes/groups, select the Users & Classes/Groups button from the product portal (this action is done before selecting the Imagine Galileo tile). Once on the Users & Classes/Groups page, click Add button to create a class/group.

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MONITORING PROGRESS

Establish a basic beginning reporting routine and determine how often you will perform progress and mastery checks and group-based and individual reports to use.

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ADMINISTER BENCHMARKS

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- If your administrators are scheduling the benchmarks, check your calendar to verify that dates and benchmark settings are correct.
- If you are responsible for scheduling benchmarks, use the test scheduling tool.
- Verify that student testing tools are enabled, as needed.
- ☐ Test Monitoring Report Monitor student progress on an assessment by viewing student responses in real-time, previewing items assessed, reviewing time spent on the assessment, and more. Moreover, it provides the ability to lock or unlock tests, ensuring a smooth and controlled assessment experience for both students and educators.

TIP: Schedule a practice benchmark assessment to familiarize students with the platform.

BEST PRACTICES

☐ Assess between benchmarks:

- <u>Formatives</u> Assign pre-built formatives or create your own to monitor student progress on target standards.
- Interims Consider administering midway between benchmarks to track progress toward grade-level mastery and to validate impact of interventions. (Note: Not all districts use the interim assessments. Check with your school leaders to determine if this is applicable to your site.)



- ☐ Inform Instruction: Identify students' strengths and areas for improvement. Tailor instruction to meet students' needs and enhance learning outcomes, focusing on specific standards where students may require additional support.
- Conference with students: Set and monitor goals, review data, and increase accountability, fostering their engagement and active participation in their own learning process.

DATA AND REPORTS

- Benchmark Performance Report Offers insights into student progress on benchmark assessments, showcasing their Developmental Level (DL) scores and performance levels. The Standards View provides a detailed look at students' mastery of specific standards on selected tests, helping educators analyze and address learning gaps.
- Individual Development Profile Displays assessed standards, percentage correct, and performance levels for each selected assessment, offering valuable insights into the student's learning progress and mastery of specific standards.
