

**NON CONSENT
ITEM 5**

**ORLANDO, FLORIDA
August 6, 2005**

The School Board of Orange County, Florida, met in special session on Saturday, August 6, 2005, at 10:12 a.m. Present were: Timothy Shea, chairman; Karen Ardaman, vice chairman; Kathleen B. Gordon, Anne Geiger and Jim Martin, school board members, Janice Pratt, deputy superintendent, instruction and curriculum services, Nicholas Gledich, chief operations officer; Frank Kruppenbacher and Andrew Thomas, school board attorneys.

Judge Richardson Roach and Joie Cadle, school board members, and Ronald Blocker, superintendent, were out of town.

A moment of silence was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

The chairman announced that any individual who would like to address an item on the agenda could do so by completing the appropriate form at the board table.

Mr. Shea turned the meeting over to Nicholas Gledich, chief operations officer, for a summary and reading of the resolution being brought before the school board.

Andrew Thomas, school board attorney, offered further explanation of the rationale behind the action being brought forward. He clarified that the board was not voting on the appeal, only on lifting a portion of the stay in the challenged area.

It was moved by Mrs. Geiger and seconded by Mrs. Gordon that the School Board authorizes and directs its attorneys to immediately prepare and file with administrative law Judge Manry of the Fifth District Court of Appeal a motion or other appropriate papers to lift a portion of the stay of the final order in DOAH Case No. 05-0160RU so that students who are eligible to enroll in high school on August 8, 2005 and who currently reside in the challenged area or who move into the challenged area prior to the time the appeal of DOAH Case No. 05-0160RU is final be allowed to attend Olympia High School.

There was discussion among board members.

Mrs. Ardaman moved to amend the motion to expand the area and students affected, including all rising 8th graders impacted by rezoning from Olympia High School to West Orange High School.

The motion failed due to lack of a second.

There was further discussion among board members.

The motion passed 4-1 (with Mrs. Ardaman out of the room and Mr. Martin voting no).

The meeting adjourned at 10:55 a.m.
