* **FPL Solar Field**, Florida Forest Service. Twenty-two miles east of Immokalee, FL. Grass and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with running and flanking. Energy infrastructure threatened.

* **Hamblin**, Osage Agency, BIA. Six miles northwest of Hominy, OK. Hardwood litter, timber and dormant brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping.

National, Big Cypress National Preserve, NPS. One mile south of Miles City, FL. Southern rough, grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Savannah**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Ten miles east of Wewahitchka, FL. Timber. Active fire behavior with creeping. Residences threatened.

* **Unity Corner**, Oklahoma DOF. Nine miles southwest of Hough, OK. Grass and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running and smoldering. Residences threatened.

* **Ranger Station Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Twelve miles south of Donalsonville, GA. Timber. Active fire behavior with single tree torching and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

Range 6, National Forests in Mississippi, USFS. Five miles east of Janice, MS. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior.

* **Crawford**, Osage Agency, BIA. One mile southeast of Hominy, OK. Grass, hardwood litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing creeping and smoldering.

* **Hunters Club**, Louisiana Office of Forestry. Seven miles southwest of Bogalusa, LA. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Cypress Creek, National Forests and Grasslands in Texas, USFS. Five miles southeast of Zavalla, TX. Brush and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A strong storm will develop on the Plains today, and strong and dry west to southwest winds will develop on the southern High Plains behind the dry line creating widespread elevated to critical conditions. Ahead of the dry line and cold front, strong to severe thunderstorms are expected to develop from Iowa south to North Texas with strong winds, large hail, and possible tornadoes. The storm will move east through the weekend bringing widespread rain from the Lower Mississippi Valley into the Northeast, but rainfall will be more scattered in the Southeast with little rain into Florida. Another storm is expected to develop mid-next week across the Plains and move east, with another round of widespread rainfall for the eastern Plains to most of the East Coast. A period of breezy winds is likely on the southern High Plains again, but relative humidity may remain elevated and minimize the potential for elevated to critical conditions.

Meanwhile, a series of fast-moving systems will move through the northern half of the West bringing periods of light valley rain and mountain snow from Sunday onward. Much of the southern half of the West will remain dry except for a period of scattered showers in the Southwest Monday. In addition, a period of strong and dry downslope winds are likely across Montana east of the Divide Sunday. Late next week, the storms may begin to track farther south and bring strong, dry winds to the Southwest and southern High Plains. Very cold temperatures are expected to continue across western Alaska most of the next week, while a storm brings widespread snow to much of south-central and eastern Interior Alaska today into tomorrow followed by a return to below normal temperatures. A cold front will bring scattered showers to Hawai'i through the weekend as it weakens, with a stronger front mid-next week possibly bringing heavier rainfall, especially to the western islands.
